Topic: Three Little Pigs

Term: Spring

Year Group: Year 1

Choose an activity each week.

Science/ICT

- Go on a materials hunt - find items in and around your home made from plastic, metal, wood, glass and fabric and create a poster to show what you found
- Find out how a material (e.g. silk, metal, cotton) is made
- Alien explanation - choose 3 materials to describe to an alien who has never been to Earth and write a sentence for each to describe their uses and properties (e.g. Glass is used in windows because it is opaque/see-through)
- Using Paint, on the computer, draw 3 objects from your home all made from the same materials
- Find out about the properties of materials by playing a game

- Something of your choice linked to 'materials'

PE/Dance/Drama/Music

- Make up a song about the Three Little Pigs
- Create a dance for the Big Bad Wolf
- Act out the story of the Three Little Pigs with a friend/family member (film it so we can watch it in school!)
- Make up a Three Little Pigs playground game (how many players? What are the rules?)
- Something of your choice linked to the Three Little Pigs

English

- Draw your favourite character from the Three Little Pigs and write 3 sentences to describe them
- Write an apology letter from the wolf to the Three Little Pigs
- Write your own version of the Three Little Pigs (what materials might they use to build their houses? Would there still be a Big Bad Wolf?)
- Think of 5 questions you would like to ask a character from the Three Little Pigs
- Create a wanted poster for the Big Bad Wolf (how might you describe him? What crimes has he committed?)
- Write a poem about the Three Little Pigs (it doesn't have to rhyme!)

Mathematics

First half term

- Practise counting beyond 100
- Learn to count up in **twos** from 0 to 30
- Practise number pairs to 10 (0+10, 1+9, 2+8, 3+7, 4+6, 5+5, 6+4, 7+3, 8+2, 9+1, 10+0)

Second half term

- Practise telling the time to o'clock
- Learn to count down in **twos** from 30 to 0
- Practise number pairs to 20 (10+10, 11+9, 12+8, 13+7, 14+6, 15+5, 16+4, 17+3, 18+2, 19+1, 20+0)

Art and DT

- Create a collage of different materials that you can find in your home
- Make a Three Little Pigs puppet theatre (including puppets from the story)
- Build your own Three Little Pig houses from the traditional materials or any materials you fancy!
- Create masks for the characters from the Three Little Pigs
- Be an illustrator - draw pictures to illustrate the story of the Three Little Pigs
- Make something of your choice linked to the Three Little Pigs

History/ Geography

First half term

- Interview a grandparent/great-grandparent about how they used to travel around the country (was it easy or difficult? Was it expensive or cheap? Did they travel often?)
- Find out 5 fascinating facts about your favourite method of transport (e.g. car, train, plane, bus etc.)
- Make a timeline of how a car, train, plane or bus has changed over the last 100 years

Second half term

- Create a poster about one of the countries in the U.K
- Design a new flag for a country in the U.K
- Write a postcard, imagining you have been to visit one of the countries in the U.K (what have you seen? What did you do there?)
