Choose an activity each day.

Science/ICT

- Research different habitats and make a triorama that describes one of them.
- Research one group out of: mammals, reptiles, amphibians, birds, and fish and present a poster that describes the characteristics of that group.
- Create a poster that shows the different plants that can be found in our local area.
- Use Purple Mash to present facts about how a polar bear is adapted to its habitat.
- Something of your own choice.

PE/Dance/Drama/Music

- Create a new exercise routine game for our class to be able to use IN THE CLASSROOM.
- Listen to *Carnival of the Animals* by Saint-Saëns (search on YouTube) and draw a picture to show the different animals he describes.
- Make up your own piece of music that imagines an Arctic storm using the Purple Mash music apps.
- Something of your own choice.

English

- Revisit what a preposition is and find examples of them in your books.
- Read your favourite book and write a book review.
- Imagine what your "Best Day Ever" would be, and then write a story based on it.
- Something of your own choice.

Mathematics

- Use Purple Mash to play maths games.
- Practice your times tables on TTRockstars.
- Find examples of decimals in everyday life and create a poster to show how and where they are used.
- Use Primary Apps to play maths games.
- Something of your own choice.

Art and DT

- Create a picture of a landscape in the style of Ted Harrison, the English-Canadian artist.
- Use old Christmas cards to make a collage.
- Create a piece of artwork inspired by the Northern Lights.
- Make a recipe that uses maple syrup and explore where it comes from.

History/ Geography

- Create a factfile which compares Canada and the UK (e.g. capital; currency; population; size of country; head of state; prime minister; languages spoken).
- Find out which animals are native to Canada and create a factfile for one.
- Use Google Earth to look at Niagara Falls and make an information leaflet for visitors
- Something of your own choice.
