

## Tynsel Parkes CE Primary Academy's Catch-up Funding Plan: 2021 – 2022

### Government guidance for funding:

Schools should use this funding for specific activities to support their pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months, in line with the guidance on curriculum expectations for the next academic year.

Schools have the flexibility to spend their funding in the best way for their cohort and circumstances.

Although schools receive funding on a per-pupil basis, the academy should use the sum available as a single total to prioritise support. There are no specific requirements for who to spend it on.

Play therapy sessions for individual children. The academy will employ a play therapist to support the mental health and wellbeing of pupils. There will be individual play therapy sessions, nurture support for classes and groups, and wellbeing champions for the school.</p>	<p>Children will have the opportunity to talk to a trusted adult about their own mental health/feelings/worries and wellbeing issues. As a result, children will be happier in school and more secure with their emotions and feelings.</p> <p>Children who are vulnerable can carry out play therapy sessions with a qualified play therapist.
