A Government report has published that since the COVID-19 lockdowns, the problem has increased. Last year, they published a report which found a growing number of children face challenges talking and understanding words – from an estimated 1.5 million in 2021 to 1.7 million in 2022 – a marked increase of 200,000. 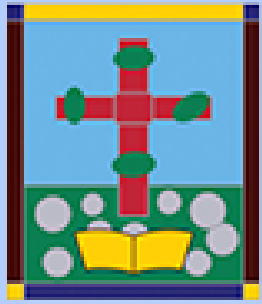

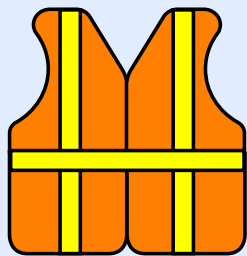

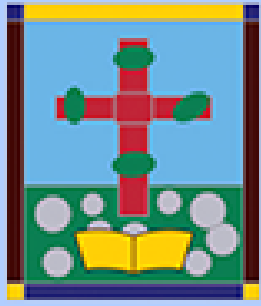

Information for all settings: Guidance on measles outbreaks

There have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands. There is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination take up in areas with low MMR vaccine rates.

Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine. It is never too late to have these vaccinations.

Sickness in School.

We have had quite a lot of children off school with sickness this week. We understand that it can be tricky with work commitments but we do have to follow the UK Health Security Agency guidance. Thank you for your support in this matter this week.

- It's fine to send your child to school or nursery with a minor cough or common cold if they are otherwise well and do not have a high temperature. If your child has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better, and the fever has resolved.
- If they have [diarrhoea and/or vomiting](#), they should stay home for at least 48 hours after the last episode.

A few reminders from the school office:

- If your child is absent from school please call the school office every day they are absent, you can always leave a message on our answerphone.
- Earrings are to be removed in advance on PE days if your child is unable to remove them themselves.
- Please do not use the car park in school as this is for staff use only. We also ask that you do not allow children to walk across the car park for any reason.
