Personal, Social & Emotional Development

We will be:
Settling into the nursery, exploring the surroundings.
Learning to take turns with the toys.
Making new relationships with other children and staff.
Learning to separate from your adult with support.

Communication and Language

We will be:
Introducing ourselves to each other.
Listening in small groups to stories.
Encouraged to speak clearly and listen to each other.
Following a one-step instruction - put your coat away.
Using longer sentences when we are talking.

Mathematics

We will be:
Counting various objects when given a set amount.
Matching sets of objects to the correct number.
Learning number counting songs.
Counting beads out into numbered cups.
Counting the spots for the ladybirds back.
Using our bodies to measure and compare size.

Physical Development

We will be:
Looking at ways to keep our bodies healthy.
What can we eat to keep us healthy, taste a variety of different healthy food?
Using glitter bugs learn how we wash our hands properly getting rid of all the glitter!
Exploring on the playground equipment finding different ways to move safely when playing.

Literacy

We will be:
Reading various stories 'all about me and starting school'.
Mark making in various different ways both inside and outside using a variety of materials.
Dough disco - improve fine motor skills ready for writing.

Understanding the World

We will be: Looking at our body parts by singing head shoulders knees and toes.
Look closely at the features on our face - can we name the different parts that we can see, use a mirror to look at our similarities and differences. Looking at the creation stories and Harvest celebrations.

Expressive Arts and Designs

- We will be:-
- Using mirrors to look at our faces - talk about our eye colour, hair colour.
 - Can we collage a picture of our face using the correct colours?
 - Exploring paint and texture-hand and footprints.
 - Dancing to music and joining in with nursery rhymes.

How you can help your child at home

- Encourage your child to talk about their day - ask them questions about what they have been doing. Share their learning book with them to prompt discussions. Read stories together, ask questions as you read, what might happen next etc.
